Thrill Me. The Power & Magic of Music in Video Art

The nomadic video art platform VIDEO WINDOW, which is run by the freelance curator Bruno Z'Graggen (Zurich), presents *Thrill Me. The Power & Magic of Music in Video Art*, a new, three-part international screening programme featuring one video from each of 23 prominent positions, twelve from Switzerland and eleven from abroad. The programme sheds light on the fundamental importance of music in video art and covers a fascinating art-historical spectrum from the 1990s to the present day.

The screening programme can be seen in Lucerne, Zurich and Basel between Saturday 28 October and Friday 24 November 2023. It is being realised as a cooperation between VIDEO WINDOW and Kunsthalle Luzern, together with the performance venues stattkino Luzern, Kunstraum Walcheturm in Zurich and Stadtkino Basel. In Lucerne, the three parts will be shown as separate events followed by artists' talks and refreshments. Each of the other two locations will host a long, festival-like screening of the entire programme.

The project addresses the audio-visual interaction between music and image in video art and communicates, in a highly entertaining manner, the cross-cultural, universal fascination, power and magic of music as the elixir of life. The synergy between the picture and the sound, noises, tones or music are an essential feature of video art. The sequence and composition of the images, interwoven with the soundtrack, form the narrative and the dramaturgy of the works. The sound and the music charge the atmosphere and reinforce and give power and presence to the images, while, at the same time, establishing their own focuses, creating listening experiences and expanding the associative and imaginative spheres of the audience.

The three-part programme brings together 23 acclaimed positions, each represented by one video work. Twelve come from Switzerland and the other eleven from Europe, North and South America, Africa and Asia. The selection stretches back to 1990 in the form of the video *You Called Me Jacky* by Pipilotti Rist and refers to three strands that, alongside the work of the Korean video art pioneer Nam June Paik, helped to shape the successful combination of image, sound and music: experimental film, MTV/pop culture and an important exploratory phase in video art before and at the threshold to digitalisation during the 1990s.

The contributions are dominated by performance-like works full of song and mimic, concert-like appearances by solo artists and groups, choreography, rhythm, dance, ritualisations and joyful experimentation. The works include videos that resemble music clips, animation, abstraction, film collages, documentaries, footage material, parodies and cinematic allusions that range as far as action movies.

The video works take us on a trip around the world and allow many musical genres to resonate: R&B, pop and K-pop, techno, African music, frevo, hip hop, classical, folk songs and film music. The focus is on powerful emotions and subjects such as individual and collective identity, gender, love and power, violence and resistance, politics and business.

Each of the three independent parts runs for 70 minutes. The programme begins with the work to which it owes its name, *Thrill Me* (2004) by the Swiss artist Una Szeemann, who accompanies Michael Jackson's metamorphosis with his megahit *Thriller* (1982). The album and music video established a new benchmark in the world of pop culture in the very early days of MTV. Michael Jackson's dazzling figure and success still fascinate us today and raise many critical questions — which are also addressed in the videos by Wojtek Doroszuk and Akosua Adoma Owusu.
